Call to Order

Roll Call - Dorney, Webber, Archibald by phone, Johnson. Bahti absent.

Pledge of Allegiance

Approval of the Minutes:

28 Sept 2020 – Motion to approve by Dorney, second by Webber with correction, motion carried unanimously.

9 Sept 2020 – Webber, we referenced the page number of the policy, do we want to put the policy number? No. Motion to approve by Dorney, seconded by Webber, motion carried unanimously. No voice heard for Archibald, so motion of 3 members.

26 Oct 2020 – Dorney motion to approve the summarized minutes issued by Webber, Archibald seconded. Motion carried unanimously.

29 Oct 2020 – Motion to approve by Webber, seconded by Dorney; motion carried unanimously by 3 members (could not hear Archibald).

Call to the Public -

Mike Wright – Mike prayed over the district; expressed disapproval of the Boards actions in approving the time, cost, and type of investigation into the work environment; expressed disapproval of his dismissal from position of Chaplain based on false information.

Frances Garcia - I decline.

Ralph Garcia – I also decline

Kathe Prentice – Expressed concern over who is being interviewed and whether they have knowledge of the Fire District work environment based on the positions and the time they are working in the environment on a daily basis; expressed thanks to community for letting her serve them; expressed thanked the Board for listening to her and for what they are doing. Chair Chris Johnson acknowledged Kathe Prentice as this was her last day as an employee.

Report from the Fire District -

Calls for the month: A shift had 20, B shift had 20 and C shift had

25. There are no events at this time. The **CON** is running like it is supposed to. **Apparatus** – we're doing some repairs, oil changes and such, everything is running pretty good. I am going to have the Ops Chief give a report on personnel; we do have one grant, an extrication grant from the Governor's Office of Highway Safety, for \$30,000, we'll be getting things going with that shortly. (Extrication Tools)

Marc Meredith, Acting Operations Chief – since our last meeting

we've had 4 new volunteers start their orientation process, we've had 2 people who were in the process complete that and are full members of the department. One of the benefits and challenges of being the type of department that we are, is that often times we're the first place where somebody starts their career and they are able to continue that career. Three of our members, we're very happy, yet at the same time sad to see them go, they have been hired by Tucson Fire. They will start their academy in January. It's a really competitive process, so for us

to have three selected is a real testament as to who this district is. Parker King, Anika Payton-Rodriguez, and Kerri Stewart. As you know, one of our firefighter positions has been filled for a period of time, we're going to go ahead and hire that position permanently, in January, and I'm very pleased to say we've already received 7 applications for that position. If you know anyone who is interested, please do encourage them to apply.

Finally, another grant we just received from the Coyote Crisis Collaborative, a state-recognized resource that is charged with helping departments big and small obtain what they need for both daily and disaster operations. We received an approximately \$5,000 grant from them, and the grant is going to go towards purchasing special equipment from Stryker, that's the same company that makes our gurneys, so when we're dealing with cognitively-impaired patients we now have another resource available to us and to them, so they remain safe during transport, and we remain safe while we're transporting them. We should have that equipment in-house by the end of the year. It is a type of cover which allows somebody who is not able to follow our directions to remain safe during transport without having to use more intrusive restraint. It will be a very nice tool to have in our toolbox that we wouldn't have had without this grant.

Monthly Financial Reports were presented by V. Rutter: **Vicki Rutter**: MS Rutter presented the financial reports to the Board, including the Balance Sheet, Profit & Loss Statement and the Cash Flow Forecast as of October 31, 2020. Motion to accept the financials as presented was made by Webber, seconded by Dorney, Motion carried unanimously.

Report by the Board Clerk on the Hughes Federal Credit Union Account – MS Webber advised the Board and community of the process she followed to obtain a pin number for accessing the bank account. During the conversation she advised that the Acting Chief Buonaccorsi and the Auditor felt there should be more signers on the account as there was no contingency plan for events such as the Chief being out of office. There is now a process [for Board members] where transfers can be completed. This item segued into item #3.

Review, discussion and possible action: Check signing/Transfers between accounts: Johnson — stated we had that problem, because we only have one signer on the Board and the Chief was on administrative leave. Normally we have two signers on each account, the Chief and Clerk. At Palominas, all signatories rest on the Board. That's a model, we have a different model. After discussion, there was a motion to add the Chair on all the bank accounts. Webber stated that she was in support of what Palominas did, having all the Board members on the account. Archibald asked if we have a recommendation from the auditors? Webber stated the auditors would like to see all Board members as signers. Archibald stated she thought that's a little excessive. She would recommend two Board members and the Chief. Johnson agreed echoed by Dorney and Webber. Motion to add Chair Chris Johnson as a signer and require two signatures per check was made by Archibald, seconded by Dorney, motion carried unanimously. Webber noted she would need the minutes to show that we voted and passed it. Webber will contact the banks and to see how we can do the paperwork.

Review, discussion and possible direction to Acting Chief regarding minutes – This was a holdover from the summer that had been tabled at prior meetings. After a lengthy discussion it was decided that transcipts of Board meetings be labeled as "transcipts" and not minutes. Johnson stated we'd postpone any other discussions on format and posting of documents to the website to a future meeting, and that what is posted to the website will be labeled as a

transcription, as long as the District is using the transcription service.

Review, discussion and possible action regarding the Board Survey: Motion to table the survey until we finish the investigation was made by Archibald, second by Webber, motion carried unanimously.

Discussion and possible action on status of Chief De Wolf's FY 2019-2020 Annual Review Johnson tabled this item.

Review, discussion and possible action to appoint Archibald and Bahti to fill 4-year term of office and consider timeline/process to select successor board members should Bahti and/or Archibald decide not serve the entire term: Johnson stated that Kurt Bahti is withdrawing from the Board, he has completed his term but does not want to be appointed. Archibald confirmed that she is willing to fulfill the term until the investigation is over and we can appoint someone to complete the term. Archibald noted that she maybe moving to Cochise County and will not be able to be on the Board when that happens. She reminded the board that we do have a process for new members. Administrator Goodwin noted that there is a formal process to go through for a new board member, there is a 90-day window for the Board to appoint a new board member, if nothing is done that time, the county can appoint a member to our board. Dorney recommended that when we post the availability include a very general guideline of what must be met as a resident (1 year) and also generally what is expected of a Board member, which she didn't get when she applied. Johnson stated that we have the right to appoint Sue Archibald to extend her term, we don't know when it's going to end, but I'd rather not have two open vacancies on the Board. It makes it difficult because it makes it a 3person Board. Archibald agreed and I will just resign when that time happens. Motion made by Dorney that Archibald be appointed to another term. Seconded by Webber; motion carried by Webber, Dorney, Johnson; Archibald abstaining from the vote.

Review, discussion and possible action for special organizational meeting in early December: Election of officers and give oath of office to Archibald. Johnson stated he would do his on Dec. 1 on Monday, Dec 7, 2020 at 0900 to Archibald.

SIDE NOTE: Archibald recommended that an update on the investigation be part of every agenda.

Possible executive session for legal advice: Motion by Archibald to go into executive session; second by Webber, motion carried unanimously.

Adjourned open session at 10:51 am.

Returned from executive session at 11:44 am. Archibald was no longer in the meeting.

Johnson reminded everyone that everything said in executive session is confidential.

Review, discussion and possible action to authorize audit of PFD IGA payments and compensation paid to Chief De Wolf to be performed by the District's auditing firm Walker & Armstrong requested to be presented in conjunction with the District's annual audit.

Motion by Webber to authorize the audit, second by Dorney, motion carried unanimously.

Adjournment – Motion by Webber, second by Dorney, motion carried unanimously.

Pledge of Allegiance

Roll Call – All board members present (Johnson, Dorney, Webber, Archibald)

Call to the public – In light of the anticipated meeting length, COVID-19 restrictions, and meeting venue, we are canceling the call to the public for this meeting. Members of the public are invited to submit written comments for inclusion in the minutes.

Recognition of Service of former Board member Kurt Bahti. An award was available to present to Kurt Bahti, but Kurt was not able to attend today.

Agenda Items – Johnson: We will not be going in order of the agenda; we will not be doing item #8.

Presentation of FY2020 Audit – presented by Jay Parke of Walker & Armstrong. The Audit firm gave an unqualified opinion on the financial statement of SEFD. Parke briefly explained the four reports presented to the Board. Board members signed the Acceptance of the Audit Report document. With regards to pension allocations: I do want to say from a position of liquidity you are doing well very well, and just in general, your debt management is very good.

Presentation of Payroll Audit was immediately following the FY2020 Audit report. Performance of agreed upon procedure report; not expressing an opinion as in FY2020 Audit; findings were presented at the meeting. There were no questions. Mr. Parke wished everyone a Happy New Year.

Approval of the minutes: The discussion was a bit confusing but I believe these were the actions:

23 Nov 2020 – Tabled. Webber was not happy with the minutes as written and wanted to summarize them further. She will review and have ready for next meeting. Archibald made a motion to approve the minutes; there was no second. Minutes were not approved.

7 Dec 2020 – Motion to approve as written was made by Archibald; second by Dorney, motion carried unanimously.

Report from the Fire Chief – we ran 52 calls last month; 12 (A), 18 (B), 21 (C). Zone 1 had 16, zone 2 had 7, zone 3 had 10, zone 4 had 3, and zone 5 had 16. Wildland billing – we have roughly \$32,000 outstanding. Apparatus; we are doing very well; repairs and routine maintenance are complete. See additional document at the end of the minutes for Ops Chief Meredith's personnel update. Because of increased COVID cases across the state, we have closed the bay doors and are restricting access to the station. We hope to resume somewhat normal routine in late January or early February. We are having new volunteers do telephone interviews and complete online classes from home at this time. As soon as we're able we'll

bring that back in. COVID vaccines — Santa Cruz County has obtained a batch of vaccine and will be rolling out a plan for vaccinations; we have started to get front-line personnel vaccinated.

Financials – Financial Reports were presented to the Board by V. Rutter; reports include the Balance Sheet, Profit & Loss Statement and the Cashflow Forecast. The Board was again cautioned about the forecasted loss (=\$5,615) at the end of the year; no action was taken. Motion to accept the financials as presented was made by Webber, seconded by Archibald; motion carried unanimously.

Review, discussion and possible action: Update of survey - motion to table this was made by Dorney, seconded by Webber; motion carried unanimously.

Discussion and possible action on finalizing Chief De Wolf's annual audit / Possible executive session for legal advice regarding the audit of PFD IGA payments and compensation paid to Chief De Wolf. / Original motion tabled by Weber, seconded by Dorney; discussion in which Archibald, Dorney and Webber were not interested in tabling. Archibald is pretty frustrated with how long this investigation was taking. She wants it done. This is where the three action items became compiled into one discussion. Dorney – does Donna have the audit information. Chair said yes. She agreed with Sue. At this point, Board Chair read a memorandum from the District's attorney. Memorandum is attached with these minutes. Archibald and Dorney were not happy about not finalizing the investigation today. The Board went into executive session at 1040 a.m. for legal advice with regards to Chief De Wolf and PFD payroll. The Board resumed regular session at 10:50 a.m.

Possible executive session for legal advice regarding the report of investigation of toxic workplace environment. This was not addressed in open session and the Board did not go into executive session for this item.

Adjournment – Motion to adjourn was made by Archibald, seconded by Webber; motion carried unanimously. (10:52)

Call to Order

Roll Call – Archibald, Dorney, Johnson and Webber present. Also present was the District's Attorney Donna Aversa (telephonically/electronically), Acting Chief Jon Buonaccorsi and Acting Operations Chief Marc Meredith.

Pledge of Allegiance

Motion made by Archibald to go into Executive Session for legal advice regarding Chief DeWolf's contract and salary. Note: Pursuant to ARS Sec. 38- 431.01(A)(3) the Board may vote to go into executive session for discussion or consultation for legal advice with the Attorney for the District regarding Chief DeWolf's contract and salary, including the report from Walker & Armstrong regarding Chief DeWolf's salary and PSPRS contributions, investigation report regarding Chief DeWolf's salary, and authorization for Chief DeWolf's salary change implemented Nov. 2019. Seconded by Dorney. The Board approved the motion unanimously. Recording stopped at 9:34 am.

Back in Regular Session at 10:55 am. Chairman Johnson reminded everyone that Pursuant to ARS Sec. 38-431(C) Executive Sessions are confidential.

Lawyer Aversa reminded all that the Board has received and reviewed a report from the Districts auditors, Walker & Armstrong, regarding compensation paid to Chief DeWolf and the compensation authorized by the Fire Board and the investigation report from the Districts outside investigator, Kate Baker, who was directed by the Board to follow up on the Walker and Armstrong report regarding overpayment related to the Palominas IGA.

Based on the review of the documentation from Walker & Armstrong and Kate Baker, motion made by Webber to terminate Chief DeWolf's contract for cause and authorize the Chair to issue the notice of termination, substantially the same form as presented, effective January 5, 2021 at 5 pm. Seconded by Archibald. The Board approved the motion unanimously. Chairman Johnson agreed to arrange to meet with Chief De Wolf to ensure that Chief DeWolf has timely notification of the termination. Archibald reminded all the investigation report is the first report we have received regarding financials, and we are still waiting for the larger report regarding on the claims of harassment. However there was enough evidence in this report to terminate for cause.

Motion made by Webber to have the District's Attorney, Donna Aversa, engage the District's auditors, Walker & Armstrong, to perform an accounting of the amount of the overpayment to Chief DeWolf effective as of the start of the initial Palominas IGA. Seconded by Archibald. The Board approved the motion unanimously. Attorney Aversa advised that per the motion she would contact Walker & Armstrong to get the engagement letter in place for the Chairman's signature, and the Chair or Attorney Aversa will let the Board know if there is an estimated timeline for the performance of that work.

EXHIBIT A

1. Status of Notice of Termination issued by the Board on January 4, 2021.

During his interview on Dec. 28, 2020, the Investigator gave Chief DeWolf the opportunity to provide her with any additional information or documentation. As of the date of the Board's action on January 4, 2021, He had not done so. The Board gave Chief DeWolf one last opportunity to provide documentation that the Board approved the increase in compensation that began as of November 1, 2018.

Although he has provided the Board with various SEFD financial statements and a narrative statement, he has not provided documentation that the Board approved his increase in compensation.

Chief DeWolf continues to deny any wrong doing and claims he read his request for an increase in compensation to the Board which then approved it. The facts do not support his position.

In fact, Chief DeWolf points to Board approved SEFD financial reports as the support for the increase in his compensation.

However, it was the Board's questioning of the very line item to which he points which was the basis for the investigation.

During the course of the investigation, Chief DeWolf acknowledged that any increase in his compensation would have to be approved by the Board and would have been reflected in the Board's minutes.

Pointing to an amount embedded in a line item submitted as part of the SEFD financial records further demonstrates:

- his failure to understand that as SEFD fire chief, he serves in a position of public trust that requires stewardship in the honest and efficient use of public resources;
- his failure to exercise good faith and due diligence; and,
- a neglect or indifference to his responsibilities as the SEFD fire chief.

The Investigator confirmed that SEFD Board minutes do not contain approval for Chief DeWolf's pay increase.

The Investigator determined, among other things, that:

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- DeWolf admits creating a document dated Dec. 3, 2018 in which he expresses his intent to ask for a raise.
 - He states: I would like to ask the Board to move my per week pay to \$1,000 allotting SEFD to make \$634.61 per week.
 - An increase of \$300 per week x 52 weeks = an annual increase of \$15,600 for over two years is in excess of \$31,200.
 - That document is dated Dec. 3, 2018. He began receiving the raise in his paycheck on November 1, 2018.,
 - The document does not reflect Board approval of the increase in pay.
- The \$300 weekly increase to DeWolf is not shown on any Board Agenda or in any of the minutes as having been authorized by the Board.
- Fire Chief Joseph DeWolf failed to obtain permission and/or proper documentation to support the increase in pay he wanted from the PFD IGA.
- Chief DeWolf directed, allowed, and/or accepted the increase without having the request placed on the Board's Agenda and/or without any documented Board vote approving the request.
- Chief DeWolf occupies a position of public trust and must act to maintain the confidence of the public and of the Board.
- He has an obligation to avoid any appearance of impropriety, and should act in a manner that brings credit to SEFD.
- A preponderance of the evidence shows that
 - The Board did not authorize the increase in compensation.
 - DeWolf accepted raise payments before the earliest date that even he claims approval could have occurred.
 - Chief DeWolf was therefore paid a large sum of money over a 2+ year period (over \$30,000) without proper authorization.

Additionally, troublesome, is that had the Board been aware that Chief DeWolf's compensation increased in 2018 by more than \$15,600 per year, it would have been a consideration in the discussion to grant a one-time 'bonus' of \$5,000 approved by the Board in 2019.

Accordingly, because there was no Board action to approve the increase in Chief DeWolf's pay which began on November 1, 2018, and further because any claim by Chief DeWolf that the minutes were somehow incomplete is disingenuous and

particularly troublesome coming a fire chief addressing his own \$15,600 annual increase in compensation,

I move that: the Board does not need to reconsider its termination of Chief DeWolf's contract and the termination stands for the reasons contained in the Notice of Termination issued by the Board on January 4, 2021.

2. Accounting into the overpayment of compensation.

Following the Board meeting on January 4, 2021, as directed by the Board, the Chairman and the attorney contacted SEFD auditors Walker & Armstrong to undertake an accounting to determine the amount by which Chief DeWolf was overpaid, including the employee related expenses associated with the overpayment, which will include a review of various records.

We anticipate that work will begin next week.

As part of the accounting, the auditors will exam the potential discrepancy between

 Chief's DeWolf's contract which provides for his group insurance coverage and SEFD policies which allow SEFD members to elect dependent coverage with the full cost of the dependence coverage to be paid by the member through payroll deductions

and

The amount of group health insurance paid by SEFD.

As well as the period during which Chief DeWolf was paid for providing service to PFD and for which SEFD refunded PFD because Chief DeWolf did not provide services under the IGA.

The Chairman will have an update at the next SEFD Board meeting.
