Strategic Planning Committee – Chief De Wolf addressed the Board regarding establishing a Strategic Planning Committee to begin development of a strategic plan for the district.

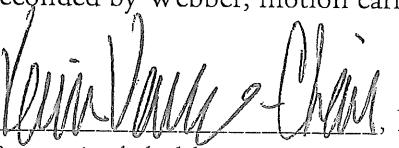

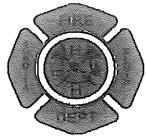
